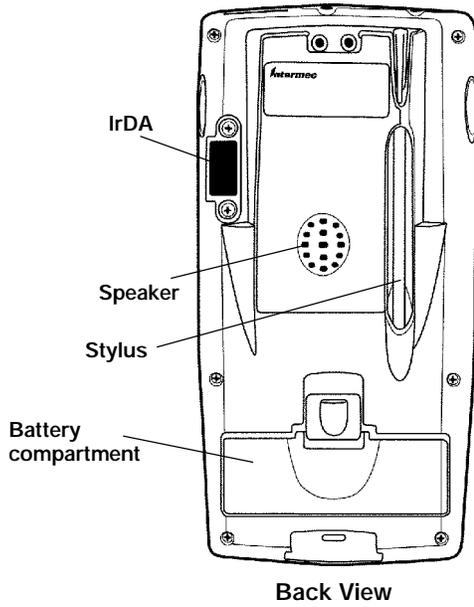
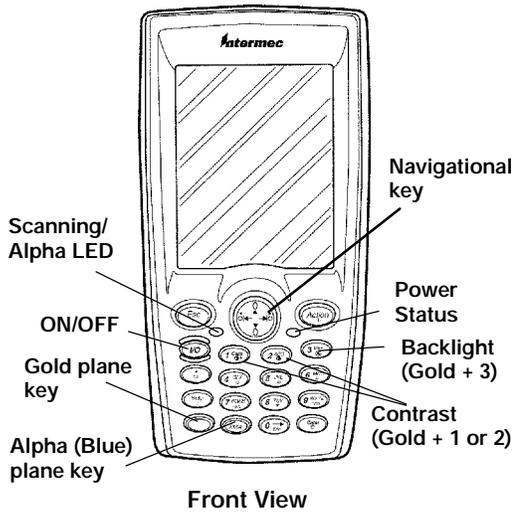
The hardware configuration of your 700 Mobile Computer may differ from the descriptions in this guide. Depending on options selected, your unit might not be equipped with a radio or scanner.

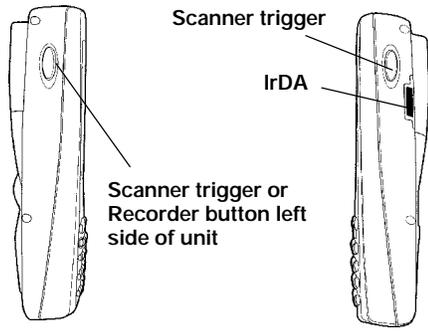
The software operation descriptions are based on factory defaults. Your 700 Mobile Computer might be shipped pre-programmed with application software that causes your 700 Monochrome to operate differently than described in this document.

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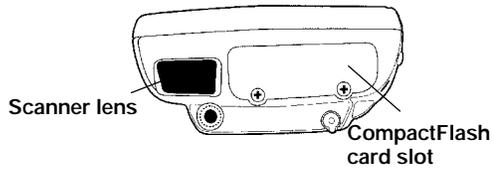
# 700 Series Monochrome Mobile Computer Description



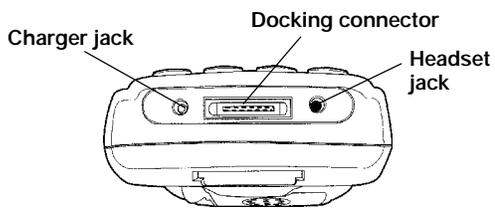


Left Side View

## 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer Features

Here are some of the key features that you will use throughout your daily operation.

- ▶ **Action** button: Press to open an item (similar to pressing ENTER on the keypad).
- ▶ **Up/Down** controls: Press to scroll through a list (similar to pressing the arrow keys on a keyboard).
- ▶ Power to run your 700 Mobile Computer is supplied by a powerful Li-Ion battery pack designed to give you approximately 6-10 hours of operation (depending on application). In addition, your 700 Mobile Computer contains backup capabilities to prevent loss of data when the main battery is discharged or when switching out battery packs.
- ▶ For **maximum** effectiveness it is important to leave the main battery installed in your 700 Mobile Computer even if it is discharged. **If the main battery is removed, it should be replaced within 10 minutes to avoid the possibility of data loss.**

## Learning About the Keypad Functions

### Gold Plane Keys

The [Gold] Ⓞ plane keys provide you access to display controls, special characters, and Pocket PC options.

Press the Gold key for each gold plane key stroke you wish to make. For example to turn on the front light, press and hold the Gold Ⓞ key plus the (3<sup>DEF</sup>) key. To turn the

front light off press the **Gold**  and the  key again.

### Alpha (Blue) Plane Keys

The **Alpha (Blue)**  plane keys work a bit differently than the Gold plane keys. When you press the Alpha key, the Scanning/Alpha  LED lights 'red' to indicate Alpha mode. The keypad stays in the Alpha mode until you press it again.

For example, pressing the Alpha  key and the  key allows the next letter to be capitalized. Again it stays in this mode until you press the Alpha  key again.

Another example of how this works, if you want to type a 'c' press the  key and the  key three times. If you need a letter that is on the same key as the last letter entered, wait two seconds after you pressed the last key, then you can enter the correct series of keystrokes to create the next letter.

### Scanning/Keypad Shift and Notification () Light

The Scanning/Keypad Shift and Notification status light (LED)  turns red, green, or yellow.

- ▶ **Flashing Green:** Indicates a 'good scan'.
- ▶ **Blinking Green:** Indicates that the scanner is initializing.
- ▶ **Red:** Indicates the keypad is shifted to the Alpha (Blue) plane.
- ▶ **Blinking Red:** Indicates the WAN (GPRS or CDMA) radio is on when the 700 Monochrome is in *suspend* (sleep) mode (see page 20 "Battery Management").

- ▶ **Yellow:** When the keypad is put into the Alpha mode, the LED momentarily changes from red to yellow to indicate a 'good scan'. This LED is also the Pocket PC Notification signal. It blinks yellow at regular intervals to indicate that a Calendar or Task activity occurred.

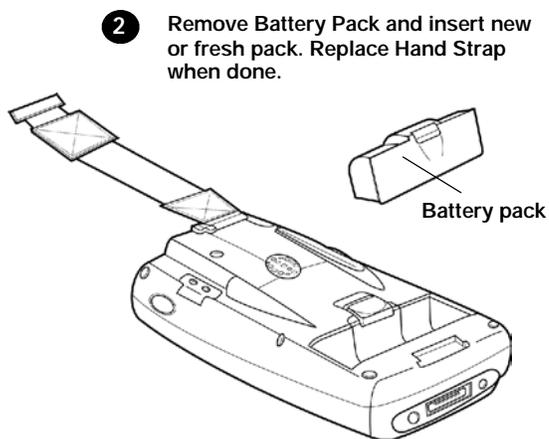
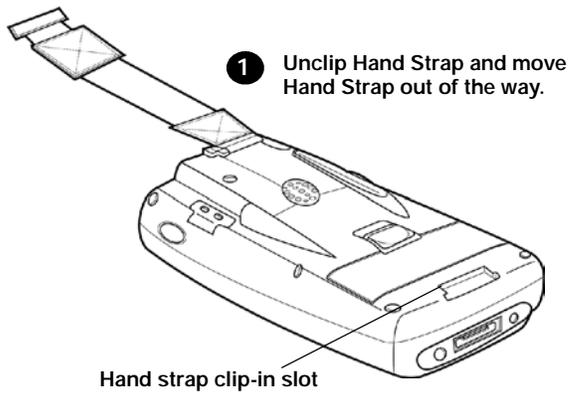
### ***Battery Status Light***

The Battery status light (LED) B turns red, green, or yellow.

- ▶ **Green:** When connected to an external power source and the battery is more than 95% charged.
- ▶ **Blinking Red:** Battery is low. The speed of the blinking increases as the battery's power gets increasingly lower.
- ▶ **Red:** Remains red until the battery reaches 95% charge level.
- ▶ **Yellow:** No battery pack in your 700 Monochrome. Can also mean that your 700 Monochrome is out of charging range 32° to 122°F (0° to 50°C). Once your 700 Monochrome gets back in range, charging resumes.
- ▶ **Alternating between Red and Yellow:** The battery pack needs replacing.

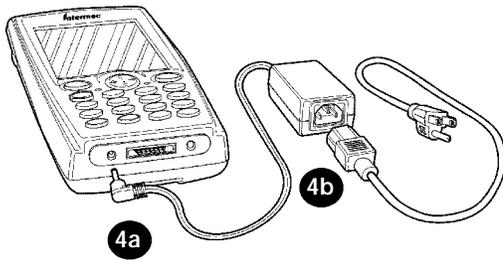
## Setting up your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer

1. Remove 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer from the packaging.
2. Release hand strap.



3. Install battery and reattach hand strap.

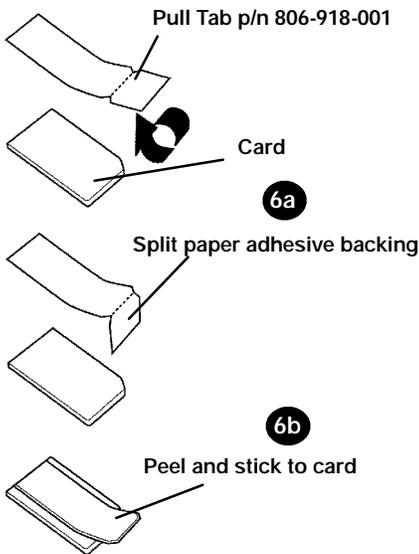
4. Connect to AC adapter or 700 Single Dock.



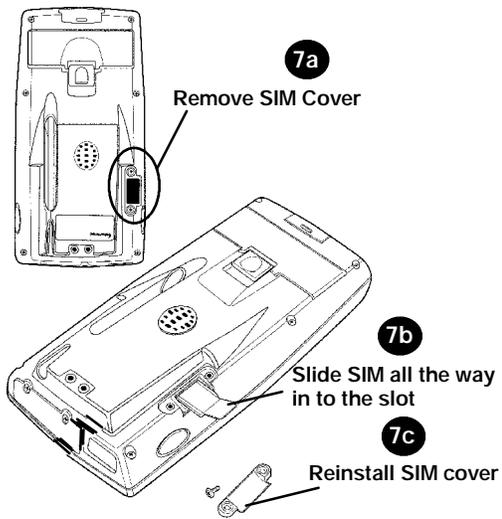
5. Charge battery pack (4 hours) before using.

**Steps 6, 7, and 8 are for 720 Mobile Computers with WWAN (Wireless Wide Area Networking) Radios. If this doesn't apply to you, skip to Step 9.**

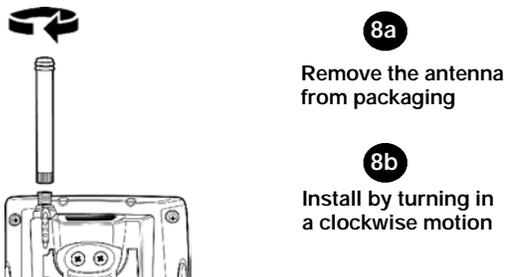
6. Install acrylic adhesive pull tabs on SIM cards.



7. Insert SIM cards.



8. Install antenna (if applicable).



9. The first time you turn on your 700 Monochrome you are introduced to the *Intermec 700 Monochrome* screen. After a few seconds you proceed to the *Welcome Pocket PC* screen. Tap your stylus to advance to the next screen.

10. You are then prompted through the *Align Screen* process. Read the display messages and follow the instructions.
11. The *Stylus* screen prompts you through the two ways to use your stylus.
12. The *Pop-up Menu* screen walks you through an exercise using pop-up menu screens. Follow the prompts and press Next when done.
13. The *Location* screen allows you to select your time zone. Enter your time zone then press Next and the *Complete* screen appears.
14. Tap the screen to complete your initial set up.

Your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer comes with Microsoft Pocket PC 2002 preloaded. For more information regarding:

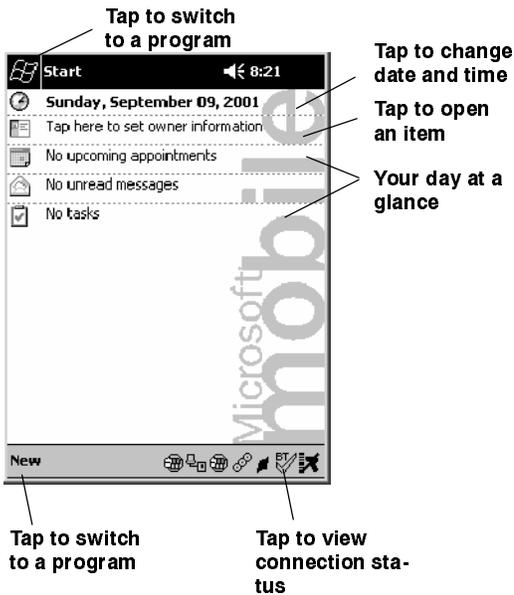

## The Today Screen

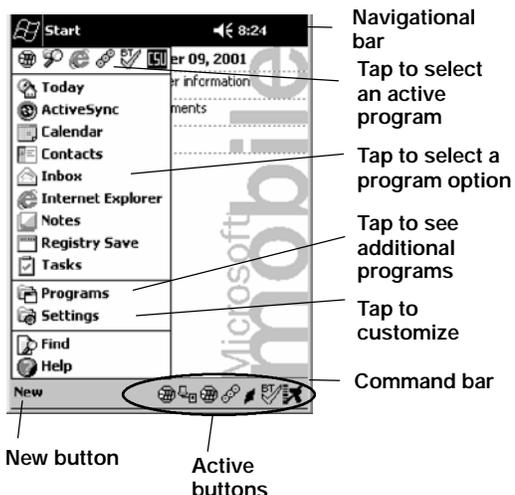
When you turn on your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer for the first time each day you'll see the **Today** screen. You can

also display it by tapping  or pressing Gold  $\odot$  +[Win], then tapping **Today**. On the **Today** screen, you can see at a glance the information you need for the day.



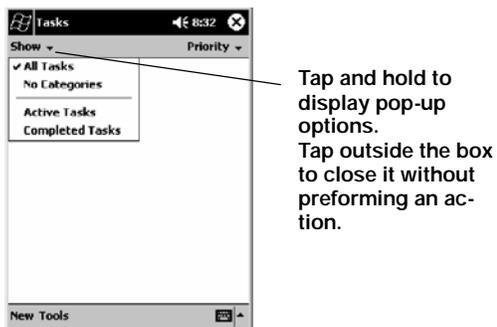
### Navigation Bar and Command Bar

The Navigation Bar is located at the top of the screen. It displays the active program and current time, and allows you to switch to programs and close screens. The Command Bar is displayed at the bottom of the screen. Use the menus and buttons to perform tasks in programs.



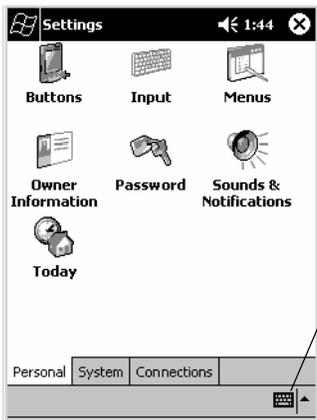
### Pop-up Menus

With pop-up menus, you can quickly choose an action for an item.

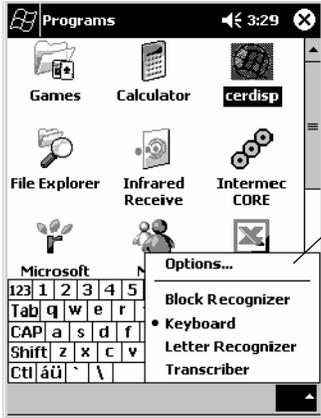


## Entering Information into Your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer

You can enter information in any program on your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer by typing with the soft keyboard, or writing using Block Recognizer. For more information regarding the options shown in the following pop-up menu, refer to the 700 Series Monochrome User's Manual or access <http://www.intermec.com> and search for 700 Monochrome.

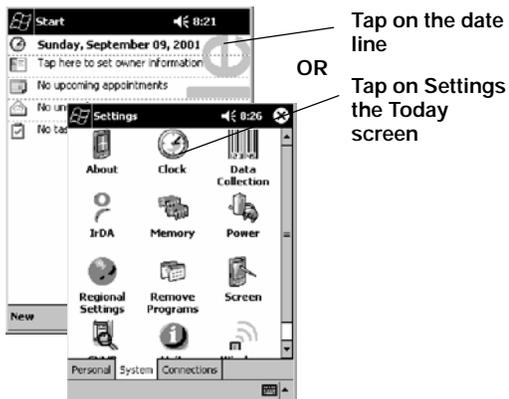


Tap on the keyboard icon at the bottom of the Command bar

## Setting the Time and Date



Tap on the date line  
 OR  
 Tap on Settings the Today screen



Select time zone from the pop-up menu

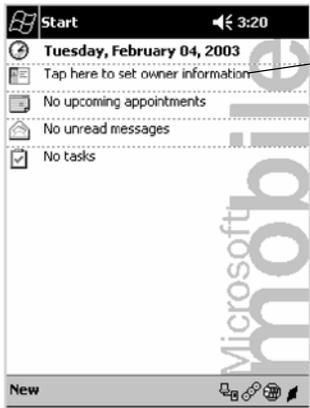
Either use your stylus and turn the hands on the clock or use the up and down arrows to make your changes.



Using your stylus and tap on the down arrow to display a calendar. Tap the left or right arrow to get to the desired month.

Tap ok when done with settings.

Tap on the ownership line

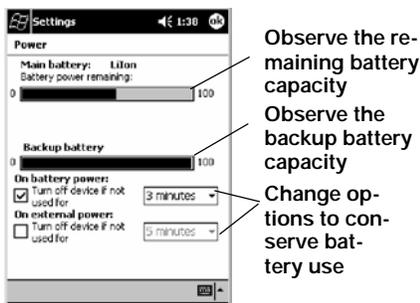
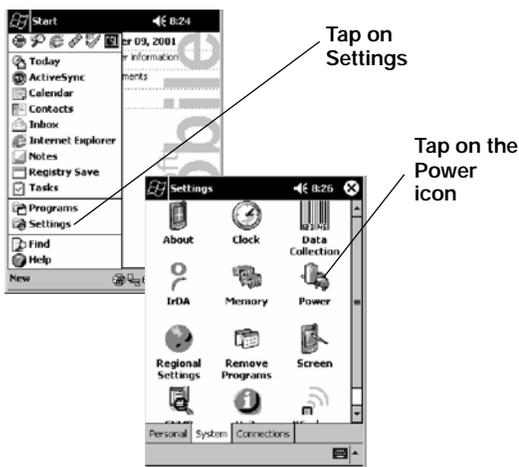


Tap on the soft key-board then select and fill out each ownership field

## Battery Management

To maximize the life of your batteries, your mobile computer can be set to automatically suspend. This is done through the Setting/System/Power menu. Options are 1-5 minutes with the default being 3 minutes.



If your Mobile Computer has an integrated 802.11b or WWAN radio (see page 24 “Checking Your Network Options”) the network drivers are factory loaded. Once you power up your Mobile Computer, the network drivers are “up and running”. This means that your mobile computer will not automatically suspend. Therefore,

you must manually suspend by pressing and holding the  button for a second or two. To 'wake it back up', press the button again.

## **Synchronizing With Your Desktop Computer**

Using Microsoft ActiveSync, you can synchronize the information on your desktop computer with the information on your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer. Synchronization compares the data on your mobile computer with your desktop computer and updates both units with the most recent information.

Before you begin synchronization, install ActiveSync on your desktop computer from the Pocket PC Companion CD. ActiveSync is already installed on your mobile computer. To install ActiveSync:

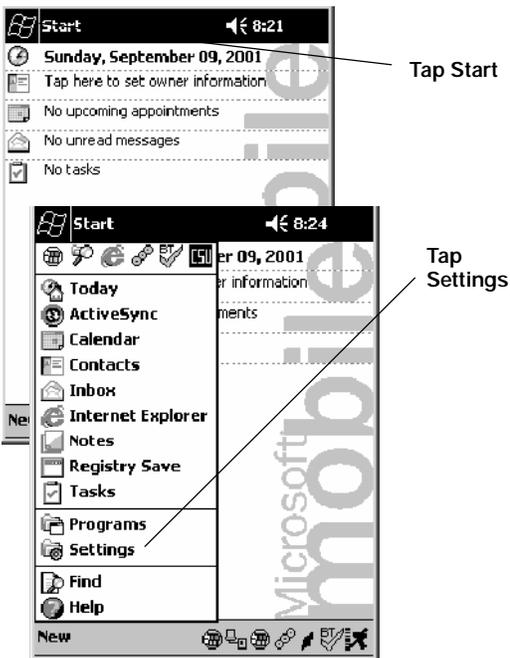
- ▶ Insert the Pocket PC Companion CD into the CD-ROM drive of your desktop computer. Follow the directions on your screen.

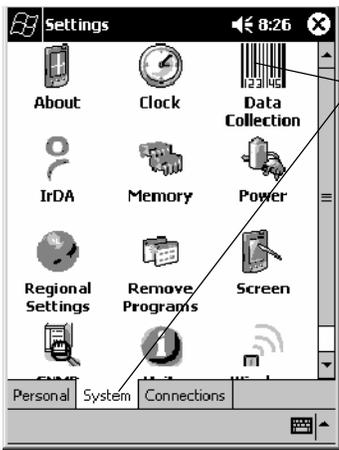
If Setup doesn't start when you insert the CD, tap **Start** and then **Run**. Type **d:\setup**, where 'd' is your CD-ROM drive.

After installation is complete, the Setup Wizard tells you to connect your mobile computer to your desktop computer. Setup Wizard helps you to set up a partnership between devices, and steps you through your first synchronization.

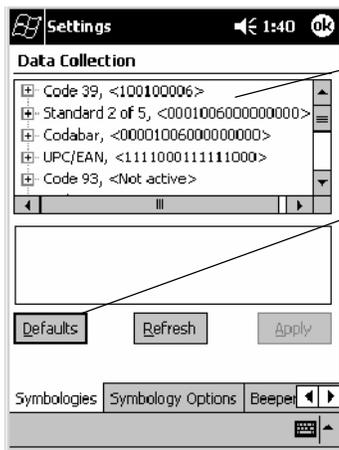
## Checking Your Scanning Options

1. Your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer comes to you with all scanner and bar code drivers loaded into ROM. To check out what bar code options your 705 Mobile Computer reads follow these screens.
2. To change any customize settings refer to the 700 Monochrome Software Tools CD-ROM (p/n: 235-045-001) or the Intermec web site <http://www.intermec.com>.

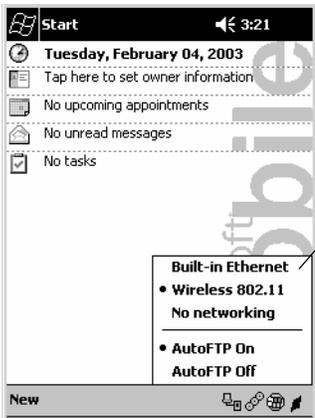

## Checking Your Network Options

1. Your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer comes to you with the radio drivers loaded into ROM. To check what radio your 700 Mobile Computer is equipped with, follow these screens.
2. To unload your network drivers refer to the 700 Series Monochrome Software Tools CD-ROM (p/n: 235-045-001).



Tap on the 'I' icon, this opens the Networking Driver Interface Specification (NDIS) tray.



Observe or change setting by tapping on your choice.

## ***Cleaning Your 700 Monochrome Mobile Computer***

Periodic cleaning helps maintain the appearance and reliability of your 700 Monochrome. When cleaning your 700 Monochrome, inspect the keyboard, covers, display, connectors, and peripheral products for obvious signs of damage or wear.

Do not use any abrasive cleaning compounds, ketonic solvents (acetone or ketone) or aromatic solvents (toluene or xylene) to clean any part of your 700 Monochrome. These solutions will cause permanent damage.

Never pour cleaners directly on the display or the case. Instead put the cleanser on a soft cloth and gently wipe the case.

### ***Case and Display***

We recommend cleaning the exterior of your mobile computer using a soft cloth dampened with MICRO-CLEAN II cleanser, made by Foresight International, Inc. 4887 F Street, Omaha, NE 68127-0205 (phone: 1-800-637-1344).

### ***If Your Mobile Computer Gets Wet***

Remove the battery pack and dry off the battery and wipe out the battery compartment. Dry off all connectors, keypad, and entire external case before using to avoid component failure and contact problems with docks, charger, and cables.

## Troubleshooting

### 700 Monochrome does not respond to applying power.

Check to ensure that your mobile computer is plugged in and that it is making good contact.

### 700 Monochrome will not turn on when the key is pressed.

The battery may be low and need recharging.

### The Power Status Light () starts blinking.

The  informs you of the status of your battery pack when it is connected to a charging device. The  reads:

- ▶ **Off** when it is in a normal operating mode or when no external power is supplied.
- ▶ **Blinking red** when the battery is low.
- ▶ **Continuous red** when it is charging.
- ▶ **Continuous green** when it is done charging.
- ▶ **Yellow** occurs when there is not a battery pack in your 700 Monochrome or it's out of charging range 32° to 122°F (0° to 50°C).

### 700 Monochrome won't power up, screen is blank.

1. Battery may be *critically low*.
2. Ensure that your computer has been on a charger for at least five minutes, then remove from the dock and perform the reset procedure. The display will then be active.
3. Continue to charge your mobile computer for 4 hours to ensure that the battery is fully charged.

### **700 Monochrome will not turn on when placed in a dock.**

Ensure that the dock is plugged in and your computer is securely seated in the dock.

### **700 Monochrome shuts down during operation.**

You may have a very low battery, try recharging the battery.

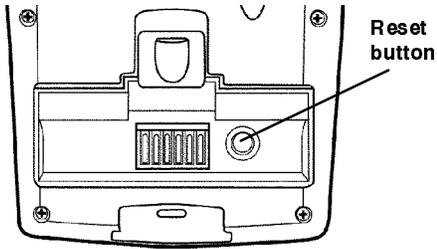
### **700 Monochrome does not turn off.**

1. May not turn *off* when it is connected to a charging device.
2. May not turn *off* when it is processing data.  
If this condition continues for a long period of time it will run down the battery.
3. In the rare event that your mobile computer locks up, do a *Warm Reboot* and if that doesn't resolve the problem then do a *Cold Reboot*. **Before doing a Cold Reboot, ensure that your data is backed up or you will lose it.**

### ***Cold Booting Your 700 Monochrome***

▼ **CAUTION:** Cold booting deletes all programs and data stored in RAM memory of the 700 Monochrome. Ensure that data is backed up to the Host PC or a Storage Card before cold booting.

1. Remove the hand strap.
2. Remove the battery pack.
3. Press the Reset button.



4. Reinstall the battery pack.
5. Press the  key and step through the prompted set up screens. This will be like you completed on your initial first time set up process.

### ***Warm Booting Your 700 Monochrome***

- ▶ Press and hold the  key for about 10 seconds.

### **700 Monochrome takes a long time to boot up after a reset.**

Normal time is between 30-45 seconds. If it takes longer than this, contact support personnel at 1-800-755-5505 (US and Canada) or 1-425-356-1700 elsewhere.
